COLLEGE PREPAREDNESS

Collaborations and stories of academic success

Similar to the CUNY Math Start collaboration at New Dorp High School, SJU and WC have leveraged existing pre-college courses and cohort models for high school students, as part of the 30,000 Degrees initiative. The Early Start Academy is a pre-college program, which brings cohorts of qualified high school juniors and seniors to SJU - creating purposeful academic pipelines from high school to professional degrees and career readiness. The Port Richmond Partnership Leadership Academy (PRPLA), is a 3-year cohort-based commitment, with a 5-week summer intensive program, intended to enhance college readiness in Port Richmond High School juniors, seniors, and future college first-year students. Students complete a community advocacy project or internship, engage in civic learning field trips, and are enrolled in credit-bearing high school and college courses. PRPLA was the impetus and model for IS 51's Markham Leadership Academy. *Thanks to our Presidents & leadership on the 30,000 Degrees Advisory Board for your vision and bridge building efforts to make this work.*

Partnered with College Access Research and Action, 30,000 Degrees has aligned internal civic engagement programs, to the professional development sequences of CARA's College Bridge model - enabling our college students to be employed by working with high school seniors to provide technical guidance through the college enrollment & financial aid process. "CARA's College Bridge program addresses the gap in college guidance for first-generation-to-college students, low income students, and students of color by training current college students, called Bridge Coaches, to support graduating high school students in their senior year and the summer before they matriculate into college." ("College Bridge." CARA NYC, caranyc.org/programs/college-bridge/.)
