


Working over several years in classic verité style, filmmaker Libin Fan chronicles the mass exodus of 130 million Chinese migrant workers as they trek from the city to their home villages for the New Year's holiday. LAST TRAIN HOME's intimate observation of one fractured family sheds light on the human cost of China's ascendance as an economic superpower.



This documentary is about Northern Uganda's Lord's Resistance Army and the 24-year long rebellion led by cult robel sader, Joseph Kony, Hear the stories of the children who live in constant fear of kidnay, forced slavery and decimation of family. Listen to the children who escaped and survived in spite of their capture.
