**D**r. Derald Wing Sue is a Professor of Psychology and Education in the Department of Counseling and Clinical Psychology, and the School of Social Work at Teachers College, Columbia University. Born in Portland, OR, Dr. Sue is the son of parents who emigrated from China. Because of a personal life-changing experience with racism directed toward his family, Dr. Sue's research direction has progressively turned to the psychology of racism and antiracism, and has led him to become one of the most prominent voices in cross-cultural studies. Dr. Sue is the author of more than 150 publications and 15 books, including *Microaggressions in Everyday Life: Race, Gender, and Sexual Orientation* (2010); and *Counseling the Culturally Diverse: Theory and Practice* (2013).
