CUNY INTERDISCIPLINARY AWARDS

The **Interdisciplinary Research Grant Program** seeks to support and encourage faculty researchers who will tackle challenges or problems that affect the needs of <u>urban populations</u> and the <u>urban environment</u>.

Applications that address specific challenges in ways that can be approached by

combining expertise across disciplines (such as the health/social sciences, natural sciences and humanities) are encouraged. The goal of this program is to provide seed funding for projects that will become eligible and competitive

for external funding and approximately 5 – 8 one-year awards of \$40,000 are

anticipated in 2017.

WITNY PROPOSALS SOUGHT BY CUNY

CUNY is partnering with Cornell Tech and leading technology companies on the <u>Initiative for Women in Technology and Entrepreneurship in New York</u> (WiTNY). The mission of the initiative is to increase the participation of women in fields related to technology in the New York market. This is a 5-year funded program focused on three key areas:

- Formal educational opportunities
- Career development
- Community Development

This <u>request for proposals</u> for Computer Science and related departments across CUNY is for those interested in obtaining funding from the WiTNY Initiative to support projects/programs that have as their goal to increase the participation of women in their departments.

A simple RFP template is available through OSPR. All **proposals are be submitted by March 17, 2107 via email to:** proposals.witny@cuny.edu . It is expected that proposals will be reviewed and that Q&A sessions will be conducted during the months of March and April and that awards will be communicated before the end of the academic year.

Proposals can be brief (1-3 pages) if desired. It is expected that in all cases, the Department Chairs will sign off on the proposals and that any materials/assets (other than physical assets) developed by a department as the result of this funding will be available for use by other departments on a going forward basis. Awards will be up to \$25,000/year. You may apply for either a one year grant of \$25,000 or a multi-year grant for up to 3 years at \$25,000 per year.
