Senior pitcher and second baseman Jacqueline Cautela has led CSI softball to a stellar 28-6 overall record, while remaining perfect in conference play with a 12-0 record. As the reigning three-time CUNYAC Tournament Most Valuable Player, Cautela is no stranger to success and has been a part of an era of dominance.

"My most memorable moments have to be winning the CUNYAC titles three years in a row," said Cautela. "To win a fourth championship in four years would be an amazing milestone and the perfect way to close out my career."

In addition to her success on the field, Cautela is an exemplary student and heavily invested in her education as a nursing major. She has participated in weekly clinical rotations at several healthcare facilities including Clove Lake Nursing Home, Richmond University Medical Center, South Beach Psychiatric Center, Staten Island Hospital North, and Staten Island Hospital South. The opportunities to earn an exceptional education and compete at the collegiate level were the major driving forces for Cautela's college decision. "Balancing the rigors of a challenging education while maintaining excellence on the field has been difficult," Cautela said. "But it has definitely made me the person that I am today and my CSI experience has been the best four years of my life."

As Cautela transitions from student-athlete to athletic alumna next month, she knows first hand of the impact that the Dolphin Fund has had on her experience.
