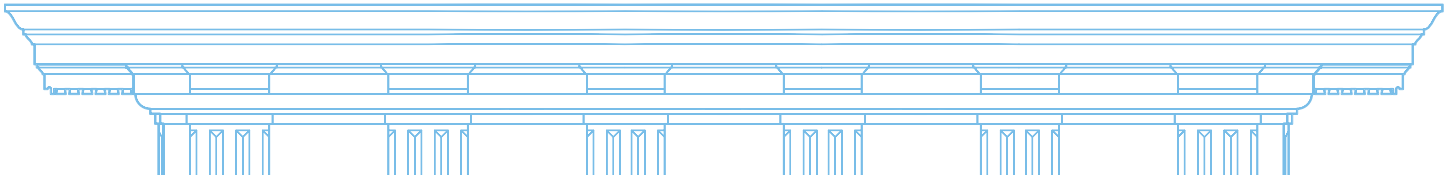

Emotion has traditionally been seen as the opposite of reason, but recent scholarship in a variety of fields has argued that these two things are really intertwined. On this panel, three faculty members address their approaches to the relation between feeling and thought. A Professor of Psychology discusses experimental research on how visual attention and physiological responses can provide insight into how emotions are processed. A Professor of Philosophy argues for the importance of empathy in the way that people make moral decisions. A Professor of English examines how surprise functions in the early English novel, as both internal feeling and external event.
