In the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the Dolphins made history as they were the first school from the CUNYAC to ever score a goal on the national stage. In the 68th minute of play, Lauren Smith scored on Johns Hopkins, making history for both CSI and the CUNYAC.

This season we had six student-athletes honored as CUNYAC First-Team All-Star selections for men's and women's soccer.
