Open Digital Pedagogy connects the classroom to the outside world through teaching practices that harness free and open digital tools to facilitate active and networked learning. Open Digital Pedagogy often uses Open Educational Resources (OER), digital teaching and learning materials, and open-source tools that can be shared, adapted, remixed, and redistributed.

In this presentation, we will demonstrate how the WordPress-based CUNY Academic Commons platform allows instructors to host course materials, facilitate discussion, and craft assignments that can task students with connecting course content to public discourses beyond the classroom. We will also introduce Manifold, an intuitive, collaborative, open-source platform for scholarly publishing. Using Manifold, instructors can publish dynamic course editions of public domain texts and open educational resources along with supplementary notes, files, images, videos, interactive content, or other resources in a single project, and it supports collaborative annotations, so you and your students can "meet" in the margins of your texts.
