On November 9th from 1pm to 2pm, we will have our first installment of a yearlong series of workshops about the assessment of Student Learning Outcomes, Program Learning Outcomes, and Institutional Learning Outcomes. We will also cover best practices that help in sustaining an effective assessment culture at an institution of higher education.

This series of workshops/chats will take place once or twice a month for the remainder of this academic year. While the focus of these installments will revolve around academic assessments, there will be numerous discussions related to the assessment of outcomes in numerous work spaces and divisions that typically permeate institutions of higher education such as Student Affairs, Athletics, and Institutional Advancement to name a few. The general subject matter of each workshop will be sent out to the campus community a week prior to the event.

What will be covered in this first workshop?

The first session will be more of a guided chat around assessment plans and practices of other peer institutions of higher education. We will focus on schools that have Middle States as their accrediting partner. If time permits, we will initiate what shall become a yearlong dialogue around the design, usage, and veracity of assessment instruments.

Who should attend this series of workshops/chats?



The short response is, everyone! However, we highly encourage new faculty and staff who possess little to no knowledge of the educational sciences and current research findings related to learning. We also encourage faculty to attend who want to use student learning outcomes as an avenue to inform and enhance their teaching practices.

This workshop will we be led by Danté A. Tawfeeq, the Interim Associate Provost of Graduate Studies, Research, and Institution Effectiveness. Dr. Tawfeeq has 27 years of teaching experience at the secondary and postsecondary levels. This includes time as professor/administrator of mathematics and mathematics education at an Historically Black College/University, Hispanic Serving Institution, as well as public and private institutions of higher education. He also served as a Fulbright Specialist to the Namibia University of Science and Technology.
