THE TEST DATE: Multiple-choice testing is expected to begin on Tuesday, February 17, 2026.

WHAT THE JOB INVOLVES:

Stock Workers (CUNY), under supervision, receive, store, distribute and care for materials, supplies and equipment; store tools; pack, unpack, count, weigh and measure materials, supplies and equipment; load and unload at the storehouse/storage facility and at the point of pick-up, delivery, or distribution and, for this purpose, may travel to the point of pick-up, delivery or distribution; operate elevator and other necessary equipment to perform loading and unloading; check materials received against invoices and note breakage and discrepancies in quantity; pick supplies from shelves to fill requisitions, lifting and carrying supplies when necessary; operate electric transports and lift trucks; keep storage facilities and materials clean and orderly; care for stock; keep records and assist in preparing inventories. All Stock Workers (CUNY) perform related work.

Some of the physical activities performed by, and environmental conditions experienced by, Stock Workers (CUNY) are: independently lifting and carrying objects weighing up to 70 pounds; packing and unpacking items to be stored on shelves; standing up to seven hours per day; bending and stooping to retrieve and store items; after training, operating a fork lift, hi-lo machine and/or other heavy machinery; handling chemicals, flammable materials, and other toxic and hazardous substances; communicating orally in a noisy work environment.

(This is a brief description of what you might do in this position and does not include all the duties of this position.)

THE SALARY:

The current minimum salary is \$37,140 per annum for new hires. The minimum salary for current CUNY employees with two (2) years of CUNY service is \$38,154. This rate is subject to change. There are two assignment levels within this class of positions. There are two assignment levels within this class of positions. Appointments will generally be made to Assignment Level I. After appointment, employees may be assigned to the higher assignment level at the discretion of CUNY.

HOW TO QUALIFY:

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS:

There are no formal education or experience requirements for this examination.

You must be able to perform the physical tasks of the job.

Residency Requirement Advisory:

City residency is not required for this position.

English Requirement:

You must be able to understand and be understood in English.

Proof of Identity:

Under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, you must be able to prove your identity and your right to obtain employment in the United States prior to employment with the City University of New York.

HOW TO APPLY:

Apply through the Online Application System (OASys) at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs. Follow the onscreen instructions to submit your application and payment. A valid email address is required. Free email accounts are available from Google, Yahoo!, AOL, Outlook.com, or Mail.com.

New OASys accounts must be verified to confirm your email address is valid and that you have access to the email account. You will receive a confirmation email from OASys to confirm your account upon registering for your OASys account. If any issues arise, contact DCAS at *nyc.gov/CivilServiceNowNYC* and select the applicable subject. If you do not receive the confirmation email, check your spam or junk mail folder before contacting DCAS.

You can pay with major credit cards, bank cards, or prepaid debit cards with a credit card logo. Veterans and individuals receiving certain public assistance may qualify for a fee waiver. The DCAS Computer-based Testing & Application Centers will be closed on Tuesday, November 11, 2025.

You must complete the entire application by midnight, Eastern Time, of the last day of the application period. If you have questions about applying for this examination, you may contact DCAS via nyc.gov/CivilServiceNowNYC and select the applicable subject.

This guide gives important information about requesting an alternate test date because of religious observance or a special test accommodation for disability, claiming Veterans' or Legacy credit, and notifying DCAS of a change in your mailing address. Follow all instructions in the Special Circumstances Guide that pertain to you when you complete your "Application for Examination."

REQUIRED INFORMATION:

Application for Examination: Follow the online instructions, including those relating to the payment of fee and, if applicable, those found in the Special Circumstances Guide.

THE TEST:

Your multiple-choice test will be given at a computer terminal. Your score on this test will be used to determine your place on a CUNY eligible list. You must achieve a score of at least 70% to pass the test.

The multiple-choice test is designed to assess the extent to which candidates have certain abilities determined to be important to the performance of the tasks of a Stock Worker (CUNY). Task areas to be tested are as follows: Receiving, Storing, Packing and Picking of Orders, Distribution, Issuing, Shipping and General Activities.

The test may include questions requiring the use of any of the following abilities:

Deductive Reasoning: the ability to apply general rules to specific problems to come up with logical answers. **Example**: A Stock Worker (CUNY) may use this ability when following step by step delivery instructions or checking if items on a delivery slip match what was received or where items are located on the shelf or where offices for delivery are located.

Inductive Reasoning: the ability to combine separate pieces of information or specific answers to problems to form general rules or conclusions; to think of possible reasons for why things go together. **Example**: A Stock Worker (CUNY) may use this ability when figuring out why a box is missing from an order or why the count on the shelf doesn't match the delivery list.

Information Ordering: the ability to follow correctly a rule or set of rules or actions in a certain order. The rule or set of rules used must be given. The things or actions to be put in order can include numbers, letters, words, pictures, procedures, sentences and mathematical or logical operations. **Example**: A Stock

Worker (CUNY) may use this ability when stacking boxes by sizes, arranging items in order by expiration or need, or loading trucks in the right order for delivery stops.

Number Facility: the degree to which adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing can be done quickly and correctly. This can be steps in other operations like finding percentages. **Example**: A Stock Worker (CUNY) may use this ability when calculating the measurement of materials to be placed on a pallet.

Problem Sensitivity: the ability to tell when something is wrong or likely to go wrong. It includes being able to identify the whole problem, as well as elements of the problem. **Example**: A Stock Worker (CUNY) may use this ability when they spot damaged goods, or unsafe stacking of supplies.

Spatial Orientation: the ability to tell where you are in relation to the location of some object or to tell where the object is in relation to you. **Example**: A Stock Worker (CUNY) may use this ability when looking to pick items for an order from shelves and other areas in the warehouse.

Time Sharing: the ability to shift back and forth between two or more sources of information. **Example**: A Stock Worker (CUNY) may use this ability when talking to a supervisor while unloading a truck or when writing down counts while checking boxes.

Written Comprehension: the ability to understand written sentences and paragraphs. **Example**: A Stock Worker (CUNY) may use this ability when reading a receiving report.

Written Expression: the ability to use English words or sentences in writing so that others will understand. **Example**: A Stock Worker (CUNY) may use this ability when completing a daily log sheet.

Certain questions may need to be answered on the basis of documents or other information supplied to the candidates on the date of the multiple-choice test.

EXAM SITE ADMISSION:

Your Admission Notice will be available on your Dashboard in OASys 14 days before the first date on which multiple-choice testing is expected to begin. Test site assignments will take your address into consideration, but nearness to your address cannot be guaranteed.

<u>Warning:</u> The use of electronic devices at the test site is prohibited. This includes phones, smart watches, cameras, e-cigarettes, vape pens and/or other portable media or electronic devices. Any such items brought to the test site will be placed in a Yondr pouch and magnetically sealed until after the exam event (Examination, Protest Review Session, TVB session). The use of headphones and earbuds are also prohibited. Only basic, hand-held calculators with addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division functions are permitted-no additional features. Devices with keyboards, word processing, or data recording capabilities are banned and will be placed in a Yondr pouch if brought to the testing site. If you use any of these prohibited devices, or remove them from your Yondr pouch before being authorized to do so, whether in the testing area, restroom, hallway, or other location at the test site, at any time before, during or after the exam event, your test score will be nullified, you will be disqualified from taking any civil service tests for up to five years, and your application fee will not be refunded.

You are also not permitted to use on site any medical assistive devices, including those that give notifications or alerts, or that vibrate, without the prior express written authorization of DCAS. You can contact DCAS by email at: <code>testingaccommodations@dcas.nyc.gov</code>.

You may not have any other person, including children, present with you while you are being processed for or taking the test, and no one may wait for you inside of a Computer-based Testing & Application Center while you are taking the test.

Required Identification: You are required to bring one (1) form of valid (non-expired) signature and photo bearing identification to the test site. The name that was used to apply for the exam must match the first and last name on the photo ID. A list of acceptable identification documents is provided below. If you do not have an acceptable ID, you may be denied testing. Acceptable forms of identification (bring one) are as follows: State issued driver's license, City or State issued identification card, IDNYC, US Government issued Passport, US Government issued Military Identification Card, US Government issued Alien Registration Card, Employer ID with photo, or Student ID with photo.

Leaving: You must leave the test site once you finish the test. If you leave the test site after being fingerprinted but before finishing the test, you will not be permitted to re-enter. If you disregard this instruction and re-enter the test site, you may not receive your test results, your test score may be nullified, and your application fee will not be refunded.

CHANGE OF MAILING ADDRESS, EMAIL ADDRESS, AND/OR TELEPHONE NUMBER:

It is critical that you promptly notify DCAS of any change to your mailing address, email address and/or phone number. THE TEST RESULTS:

If you pass the multiple-choice test, your name will be placed in final score order on a CUNY eligible list, you will be given a list number and you will be notified by email of your test results. The eligible list determines the order by which candidates will be considered for appointment. If you meet all requirements and conditions, you will be considered for appointment if your name is reached on the eligible list.

If you believe that your test part was rated incorrectly, you may submit an appeal of your score to DCAS, Committee on Manifest Errors, through the Online Application System (OASys). Your appeal must give specific reasons why your score should be higher. Your appeal may result in a higher or lower rating.

To access the appeal portal of OASys, please log into your OASys account at www.nyc.gov/examsforjobs and use the following steps:

- 1. Navigate to the Dashboard for the Appeals tab.
- 2. Click the NEW APPEAL button to create and submit your appeal.
- 3. Select the exam from the Exam drop-down list, and
- 4. Select the exam part from the Exam Part drop-down list.
- 5. Select the reason for your appeal from the Appeal Reason drop-down list (if applicable).
- 6. Enter the details of your appeal by providing specific reasons why your score should be higher.

Note: You may attach up to 5 documents to support your appeal by using the attachment functionality.

SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS:

Make-up Test:

You may apply for a make-up test if you cannot take the test on the regular test date(s) for any of the following reasons:

- 1. being ordered to military duty; or
- compulsory attendance before a court or other public body or official having the power to compel attendance; or
- on-the-job injury or illness caused by municipal employment where you are an officer or employee of CUNY; or
- 4. absence from the test within one week after the death of a spouse, domestic partner, parent, parentin-law, sibling, child or child of a domestic partner where you are an officer or employee of CUNY; or 5. a clear error for which the Department of Citywide Administrative Services or the examining agency
- is responsible; or
- 6. a temporary disability; or
- 7. pregnancy, childbirth or a related medical condition.

To request a make-up test, contact Administration, Customer, and Exam Support (ACES) by email at testingaccommodations@dcas.nyc.gov, as soon as possible, and include documentation of the special circumstances that caused you to miss your test.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Selective Certification for Special Experience: If you have the special experience listed below, you may be considered for appointment to positions requiring this special experience through a process called Selective Certification. If you qualify for Selective Certification, you may be given preferred consideration for positions requiring this special experience. Follow the instructions given to you on the day of the multiple-choice test to indicate your interest in such Selective Certification. Your special experience will be checked by CUNY at the time of appointment.

- 1. Selective Certification for Automotive Parts Experience (ASF): At least one (1) year of satisfactory, full-time experience in the handling, distribution, and/or use of automotive parts in a retail, wholesale, military or automotive service facility.

 2. Selective Certification for Fork Lift, Hi-Lo and Pallet Mover Experience (FLH): At least one (1)
- year of satisfactory, full-time experience operating a fork lift, hi-lo and/or pallet mover.

The above Selective Certification requirements may be met at anytime during the duration of the **list**. If you meet this requirement at some future date, please submit a request by contacting DCAS via the following link: nyc.gov/CivilServiceNowNYC using the "Selective Certification" subject. Please include the examination title and number, your full name, OASys Profile ID number, and the selective certification(s) you are requesting in your submission.

Appointment of New York City Civil Service Employees: Please note that CUNY is a separate municipal employer; therefore, employees of New York City agencies cannot transfer to CUNY. If an employee of a New York City agency accepts a position with CUNY, the employee's date of appointment for the purposes of salary, seniority, and time and leave accruals is his/her date of appointment to CUNY.

List Termination:

The eligible list resulting from this examination will be terminated one year from the date it is established, unless extended by CUNY.

Application Receipt:

You will be emailed a receipt immediately after you have applied for the examination. If you do not receive this receipt, check "Junk", "Trash", or "Spam" folders for the primary email linked to your Online Application System (OASys) account. If you are unable to locate the email, you can view a summary of the notification email to you on your OASys Dashboard, then Notifications. If you are still unable to find the email, please email DCAS via the Contact feature available in OASys with a description of the issue and include the exam number and your profile number located on your Profile page. While on your Profile page, check that the email addresses you provided are correct and/or updated.

This examination is for positions with the City University of New York (CUNY) only. If you would like to apply for the position of Stock Worker with City agencies, you must submit a separate application and filing fee for Exam No. 6105 from November 5, 2025 through November 25, 2025. If you would like to apply for the position of Stock Worker with NYC Health + Hospitals (NYC H+H), you must submit a separate application and filing fee for Exam No. 6107 from November 5, 2025 through November 25, 2025.

PENALTY FOR MISREPRESENTATION:

Any intentional misrepresentation on the application or examination may result in disqualification, even after appointment, and may result in criminal prosecution.
