The New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (NYC Health Department) will reduce the number of mosquitoes in your neighborhood using the pesticide Duet.



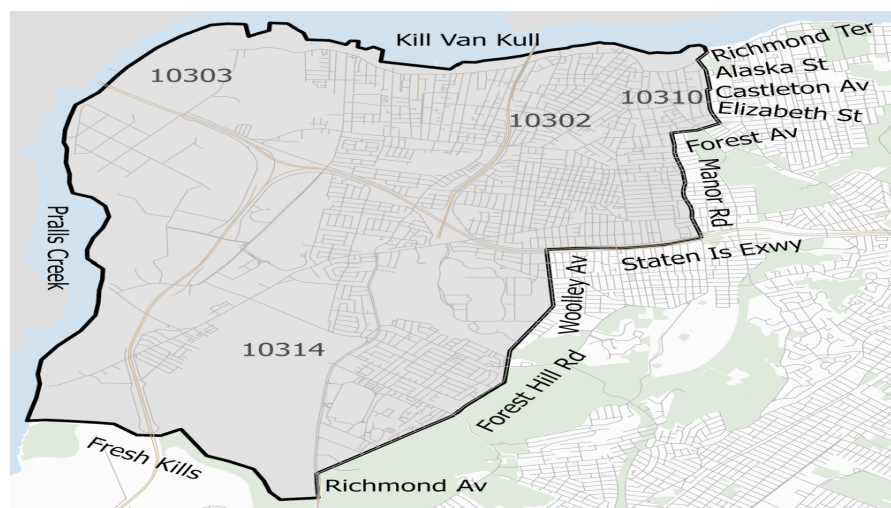
August 3, 2026 (Or August 4, 2026 in case of inclement weather)

The area to be sprayed by truck is shown on this map:



The pesticides used by the NYC Health Department for mosquito control pose low risk to people and pets. Some people who are sensitive to the spray ingredients may experience short-term eye or throat irritation, or a rash. People with asthma and other respiratory conditions may also be affected.

To reduce your risk:

- Stay indoors whenever possible. You can keep air conditioners on. While it is not necessary to do so, you may close air conditioner vents or use your air conditioner's recirculation mode.
- Wash your skin and clothing with soap and water if exposed to the pesticide.
- Always wash homegrown fruits and vegetables with water.
